Dear Mr. Desselle:

The January 2004 cold snap in New England highlighted the need for better coordination between natural gas pipelines and the electric grid, including ISO/RTOs and gas fired generators. During the first half of 2004, the NAESB Gas-Electric Coordination Task Force (GECTF) explored the underlying coordination problems and identified areas where standards development would help in resolving these problems. I am pleased to see that NAESB is beginning to work on standards stemming from the work of the GECTF to alleviate the coordination problem.

I want to emphasize how important I think the development of such standards is to ensure the smooth flow of gas to generators and to the public interest we all share of keeping the lights on and homes warm in the winters ahead. I am concerned that we may go yet another year without the improvements in communications between pipelines and generators and the necessary coordination of business practices of both industries. I believe that it is crucial for standards to be in place by next winter to alleviate these coordination problems.

In the past, when the need for such standardization was apparent, GISB stepped up and through the cooperation of all the industry facets was able to develop a core set of business practice standards in a short amount of time. I believe the same effort is needed now to integrate the business practices of the gas and electric industries. From my perspective, it is clearly more efficient and less costly for the industry to develop these standards through the consensus procedures of NAESB than for the Commission to set up its own procedures to try to accomplish this goal. I therefore want to reiterate how pleased I am that the gas and electric industry segments are willing to put in the time and

¹ I was at the Commission when it first established the Working Groups to establish the first set of capacity release standards, and realize the time and expense that the industry had to incur in order to develop those standards under Commission auspices. The consensus procedures of NAESB are a more efficient and cost-effective method.

effort to reach the necessary compromises to develop these standards, and I look forward to seeing a NAESB filing by June 1, 2005, so that these standards can be in place by next winter.

The following standards, model business practices and reports were submitted to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in 2004 and 2005. It has been noted where the FERC has taken action.

WGQ Version 1.7 Standards

On April 14, 2004, North American Energy Standards Board (NAESB) submitted its most current Wholesale Gas Quadrant (WGQ) Standards in Docket Nos. RM96-1-000 and RM98-1-000 et al. These standards were published by NAESB on Dec. 31, 2003. Version 1.7 updates and builds upon Version 1.6. On Dec. 21, 2004, FERC issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NOPR) proposing to adopt Version 1.7 as well as two sets of standards ratified subsequent to publication: standards implementing the standards of conduct contained in FERC Order No. 2004, and standards implementing gas quality reporting requirements. On Oct. 1, 2004, an errata was filed.

WEQ Seams Catalog

On June 15, 2004, NAESB submitted, for informational purposes only, the Wholesale Electric Quadrant (WEQ) Seams Catalog which was the product of the WEQ Seams Subcommittee. The catalog identified 134 electric seams issues. Of these, the Joint Interface Committee, a group composed of representatives from NAESB, the North American Electric Reliability Council (NERC) and the ISO-RTO Council (IRC) concluded that 26 issues could be addressed through the promulgation of business practice standards. The balance were either reliability issues better handled by NERC, regional issues better handled by the IRC, or required further information before an assignment could be made. NAESB has since received two requests for standards addressing 12 seams issues (R04020 and R04032).

WGQ Creditworthiness Standards

On June 16, 2004, NAESB submitted in Docket Nos. GT02-35-000 and GT02-38-000 the 10 WGQ creditworthiness standards approved by the WGQ Executive Committee (EC) and ratified by the WGQ membership. The WGQ Business Practices Subcommittee recommended 24 standards, which were also included in the submission as part of the record. FERC issued a NOPR on Feb. 12, 2004 in Docket No. RM04-4-000 proposing to adopt the 10 standards plus some of the other proposed standards that were discussed at the EC but not adopted. This NOPR has since been consolidated with the Commission's consideration of WGQ Version 1.7 standards (see above).

WGO Order 2004 Standards of Conduct

On Aug. 6, 2004, NAESB submitted in Docket Nos. RM96-1-000, RM98-10-000 and RM01-10-000 its standards implementing the wholesale gas standards of conduct contained in FERC Order No. 2004. The standards of conduct govern the relationship between companies that transmit energy and their affiliates. Subsequently, FERC issued Order No. 2004-B on Aug. 2, 2004 and Order No. 2004-C on Dec. 21, 2004. On December 21, FERC proposed to adopt these standards in conjunction with the WGQ Version 1.7 standards (see above) with one change. Since the standards were developed prior to the issuance of Order No. 2004-A, and Revised Standard 4.3.23 does not specify a location for posting voluntary consent to information disclosure by non-affiliated customers as required by § 358 of the Commission regulation, the NOPR proposes amending the standards to permit such postings. NAESB is in the process of making the amendment and anticipates completion before a final order is issues.

WGQ Gas Quality Reporting Standards

On Nov. 1, 2004, NAESB submitted in Docket Nos. 96-1-000 and RM98-10-000 the WGQ gas quality reporting standards. The standards provide for the posting of gas quality information on transportation service providers (TSPs) web sites, and address: (1) reporting physical and chemical properties of natural gas defined in pipeline tariffs in a standardized format on the informational postings portion of the pipeline web site, and (2) reporting the average daily gas quality data collected at points representative of mainline flow in a standardized downloadable format. In a NOPR dated Dec. 21, 2004, FERC proposed to also adopt these standards in conjunction with the WGQ Version 1.7 standards (see above).

Gas-Electric Coordination Task Force Final Report

On Nov. 30, 2004, NAESB submitted, for informational purposes only, the Final Report from the Gas-Electric Coordination Task Force (GECTF). The report identified gas-electric coordination issues, provided a level of categorization of these issues, and identified which issues could be addressed through the development of NAESB standards. Since submitting the Final Report, three such requests for standards have been submitted: R04016, the development of a standard energy day; R04020, the development of standards relating to electric transaction scheduling and timelines; and, R04021, the development of standards to address daily communications between pipelines and power generation facilities. The scoping activities of GECTF have been carried on by the newly formed Board level Gas-Electric Interdependency Committee.

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WEQ Version 0, OASIS and Standards of Conduct Standards

On Jan. 18, 2005, NAESB submitted in Docket No. RM05-1-000 its first complete set of wholesale electric standards. The filing included three sets of standards: (1) business practices that address Open Access Same-Time Information Systems (OASIS) and OASIS Standards & Communications Protocol (S&CP) and Data Dictionary; (2) business practices that directly related to the North American Electric Reliability Council's (NERC) Version 0 reliability standards for coordinate interchange, area control error (ACE) equation special cases, manual time error correction, and inadvertent interchange payback; and (3) standards implementing the wholesale electric standards of conduct contained in FERC Order No. 2004.

SDOAA Filing

In addition to the above FERC filings, NAESB submitted its one-time notification under the Standards Developing Organizations Advancement Act of 2004 (SDOAA) on Sept. 17, 2004. This submission to the U.S Department of Justice Antitrust Division and the U.S. Federal Trade Commission "registers" NAESB as a Standards Developing Organization (SDO). SDOAA extends the protections provided researchers under the National Cooperative Research and Production Act of 1993, to standards developing organizations. SDOAA does not change our anti-trust responsibilities, it only limits the potential damages for violations. SDOAA also provides for SDO's to benefit from courts applying a case-by-case "rule of reason" antitrust analysis to standards development activities even where the rule of per se illegality otherwise might apply. The benefit of receiving rule of reason treatment for a questioned action that otherwise would be deemed illegal per se is significant. Finally, SDO's may recover attorneys' fees from plaintiffs that bring unsuccessful antitrust claims against them.




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NAESB Wholesale Electric Quadrant Committee Structure

NAESB AT A GLANCE: MONTHLY UPDATE

FIRST WEQ FILING WITH FERC: Ms. Rae McQuade, NAESB Executive Director, reported on the first Wholesale Electric Quadrant (WEQ) standards filing with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). The standards include business practices that address OASIS, OASIS Standards & Communication Protocol and Data Dictionary. The filing also includes business practices that are complementary to North American Electric Reliability Council (NERC) reliability standards for coordinate interchange, area control error (ACE) equation special cases, manual time error correction, inadvertent interchange payback. Finally, it included standards of conduct to comply with FERC Orders 2004, 2004-A, and 2004-B. The filing did not include ratified standards for Transmission Load Relief (TLR), the Funds Transfer Agency Agreement (FTAA), or enhancements to the Coordinate Interchange Business Practices (CIBP). The filing was made in FERC docket number RM05-5-000.

ENERGY DAY UPDATE: Mr. Lou Oberski, Director of Electric Market Policy, Dominion Resource Services, Inc., and WEQ Executive Committee Chairman, provided an update on the Energy Day efforts. The Joint Subcommittee on Energy Day was formed from the Business Practices Subcommittees of the WEQ and the Wholesale Gas Quadrant (WGQ) in response to NAESB Request Number R04016 submitted by KeySpan and Duke Energy to develop a standardized energy day. The subcommittee will meet again on January 24th and 25th in Houston. The agenda at the January meeting will provide a forum for companies or groups of companies to present straw man proposals for energy day. Mr. Rick Miles, Director of Dispute Resolution Services at FERC will facilitate the meeting. The subcommittee has meetings scheduled every two weeks through April 2005. FERC Chairman Wood has requested a deadline of June 1st in a letter sent to NAESB Chairman Desselle last month. Also, at the Dec. 15 FERC open session, Commissioner Brownell requested that NAESB provide periodic updates to the Commission on its efforts.

UPDATE ON BOARD COMMITTEES: Mr. James Cargas, Deputy Director of NAESB, reported on the four board committees: Gas-Electric Interdependency (GEIC), Resources, Retail Awareness Committee, and a newly formed retail committee.

- The Gas-Electric Interdependency Committee (GEIC), chaired by Mr. Jim Templeton, Principal of Comprehensive Energy Services and member of the NAESB Managing Committee, continues to consider what types of activities related to gas and electric interdependency could result in NAESB standards development.
- The Resources Committee, chaired by Ms. Gloria Ogenyi, Director of Energy and Market Policy of Conectiv, has been revising the NAESB membership materials and the membership web page, and conducting outreach to prospective members. The Resources Committee set a goal of 30 net new members by March 2005, and has added eleven new members to date.
- The Retail Awareness Committee (RAC), chaired by Mr. Cade Burks, President of EC Power, will be sending letters to twenty-four state commissions offering to provide an educational presentation on existing model business practices and current drafting efforts. RAC hopes to leave these meetings with input on the 2005 Annual Plans and guidance on areas for further development.
- Finally, the NAESB Board created a fourth committee at its Dec. 9 meeting to review whether the two retail quadrants should be merged or be restructured to bring membership levels above NAESB minimum levels. The Committee will report to the Board of Directors in the fourth quarter.

ORDER 2004 REVISIONS TO WGQ STANDARDS: Mr. Jim Buccigross, Vice President, 8760, Inc., and NAESB Executive Committee Chairman, reported on the Dec. 21, 2004 FERC Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in Docket No. RM96-1-026 (NOPR) that proposes adoption of NAESB WGQ Version 1.7 Standards, standards implementing FERC Order Nos. 2004-A and 2004-B (Standards of Conduct), and gas quality reporting standards. The Commission noted in paragraph 10 of the NOPR that "Revised Standard 4.3.23 does not specify a location for posting voluntary consent to information disclosure by non-affiliated customers..." and "Posting this information as a separate category represents a better practice, since it will make it easier for the Commission as well as other parties to find and access this information." Mr. Buccigross said the process to modify Standard 4.3.23 to comply with the NOPR should be complete prior to the issuance of a final order by FERC.

UPDATE ON THE GAS QUALITY STANDARDS & NATURAL GAS COUNCIL: Mr. James Cargas, Deputy Director of NAESB, reported that the Natural Gas Council Plus (NGC+) met with FERC Chairman Wood on Dec. 17, 2004 and provided him two white papers: "Liquid Hydrocarbon Dropout in Natural Gas Infrastructure," and "Natural Gas



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Interchangeability and Non-Combustion End Use." The working groups that drafted these white papers included thirty-one NAESB members. Ms. Dolores Chezar, Director, Regulatory Policy for KeySpan Energy stated the interchangeability paper is still considered to be in draft form and efforts to revise it will continue. Mr. Cargas also reported that on Oct. 20, 2004, NAESB's membership ratified the gas quality reporting standards for tracking physical and chemical properties of natural gas defined in pipeline tariffs. These were submitted to FERC and are part of the Dec. 21, 2004 NOPR (see above).

UPDATE ON RETAIL TRADING PARTNER AGREEMENT AMENDMENTS: Ms. Rae McQuade, Executive Director for NAESB, stated the retail quadrants have been developing a Trading Partner Agreement (TPA) based on the WGQ version. The TPA provides an agreement between trading partners to determine how each will communicate information across computer systems through XML or EDI format. Ms. Dale Davis of Williams Gas Pipeline added the retail subcommittee made some minor changes to the WGQ version to make it generally applicable and added a user's guide as a companion document for the retail version of the agreement. The draft TPA is posted for industry comment. The comment period ends Feb. 11, 2005.

RETAIL SUBCOMMITTEE REORGANIZATION: Mr. Phil Precht, Director of Gas Choice Programs at Baltimore Gas and Electric, said that after more than a year of experience with the retail subcommittee structure, the retail executive committees are improving the process of developing standards by reorganizing the subcommittee structure. The reorganization is modeled after the WGQ structure. The Customer Processes Subcommittee and Supplier User Interface Subcommittee will combine to be the Business Practices Subcommittee, and a new Information Requirements Subcommittee will be created. The Technical Electronic Implementation Subcommittee will remain unchanged.
